Have you had any additional training and development at Nylacast?

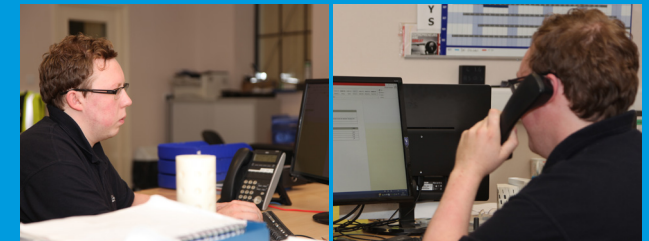
